

Summer Camp General Information

1. Camp begins at 9:00am and concludes at 4:00pm each day. All campers need to arrive by 9:00 am. If a camper has not arrived by 9:15 am., we reserve the right to turn those campers away without a refund.
2. For the convenience of working parents, early and late supervision is provided from 7:30 am.-9:00 am. And from 4:00pm-5:30pm, for an additional charge of \$5.00 weekly.
3. Pre-registration is required for all campers. A non-returnable registration fee of \$5 is required of all campers. This fee must be paid regardless if a camper signs up for one or more weeks of camp. Deposits may not be transferred from one week to another.
4. **Fee Structure:** \$5—a one time non-returnable registration fee. \$60 per week first child
\$50 per week second child \$45 per week third child
5. **Discipline Policy**-Parents and campers are required to read and sign the discipline policy form.
6. Please notify us in writing if you need to cancel any session. Non-attendance, without cancellation, does not disqualify you from paying the balance on your camper account. The reservation deposits are non-returnable.
7. Medical Treatment— Pulaski County Recreation Staff will not administer any medication unless directed by camper's parent or guardian. All medication must be in the original bottle. A medication form including what time, what amount of medication to be administered to the child must be filled out before it can be administered. No medication may be administered on an as needed basis.
8. Participants are responsible for their own accident insurance.
9. Pulaski County Recreation staff is not responsible for lost or stolen items and will not replace any items.
10. Pulaski County Recreation does not discriminate on the basis of race, creed, disability, national or ethnic origin.
11. **What to bring to camp**-Almost all camp activities are conducted outside, so please dress campers appropriately and comfortably for camp. **COME DRESSED FOR MESS!** They will need the following items: shorts, t-shirt, tennis shoes, hat, swimsuit, towel, lunch with drink, sunscreen, and water bottle. Everything your child brings to camp MUST have a name on it, including clothes. Send everything in a backpack and make sure your child can carry it him/herself. Remember children will get dirty and messy!
12. **What not to bring to camp**—Toys of any kind, gum, any valuables, weapons of any type, trading cards, game boys or electronic games, etc. WE ARE NOT RESPONSIBLE if any of these items become lost, stolen, or broken. If items are brought from home parents will be called at home or work to pick the items up.
13. **Sunscreen**-We strongly recommend you to provide sunscreen for your camper. Parents should make the initial application. Please label the sunscreen for your child. Because of possible allergic reactions, we can not allow children to share sunscreen. If your child needs sunscreen applied by a staff member please make sure to fill out a medicine form for each month.
14. **Illness & Injury**-We are equipped with First Aid kits to handle minor emergencies. If there is any question that the injury is more serious (and not life threatening) then we will contact you to seek advice on how to proceed. Please remember that camp is not a place for sick children. Keep a child home if he/she has a fever above 100 degrees, diarrhea, or vomiting.
15. **Pool concession stand**-The pool concession stand may be open during camp hours. Campers may purchase food or snacks during snack times. Campers are responsible for keeping up with their money.
